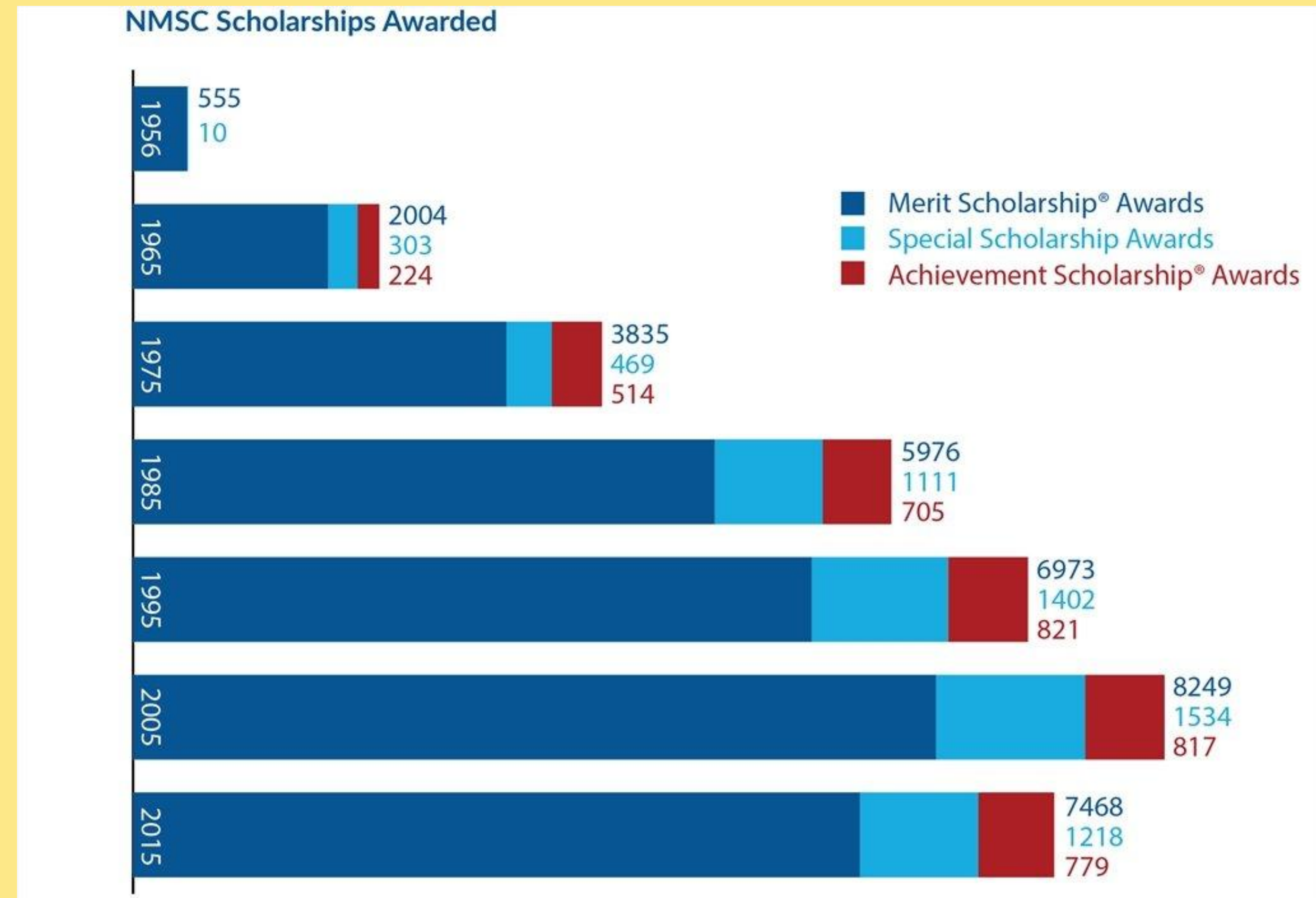
## BASIC FACTS

- ▶ Founded in 1955 to recognize academically high-achieving students
- ▶ PSAT and NMSQT joined to become qualifying test in 1971
- ▶ 2,500 National Merit \$2,500 scholarships are awarded
- ▶ 950 corporate-sponsored scholarships are awarded
- ▶ Approximately 160 colleges offer about 3,800 National Merit Scholarships
- ▶ National Merit also recognizes Commended students who do not continue in the scholarship competition



# AWARDS OVER TIME

- ▶ Merit Scholarships are awarded directly from NMSC
- ▶ Special Scholarships are awarded from corporate sponsors
- ▶ Achievement Scholarships are awarded from United Negro College Fund





# NATIONAL MERIT PROCESS

- ▶ Junior year PSAT is the official test for entry
- ▶ About 1.5 million students take the PSAT junior year
- ▶ PSAT scores are used to calculate the Selection Index
- ▶ PSAT scores are available in December

# SELECTION INDEX

- ▶ Calculated by dropping zeros, then doubling the verbal score and adding the math score
- ▶ Example:
  - ▶ Verbal = 740
  - ▶ Math = 720
    - ▶  $74 \times 2 = 148 + 72 = 220$
    - ▶ Maximum = 228

# SELECTION INDEX CUTOFFS

- ▶ Commended cutoffs are set nationally

# NATIONAL MERIT PROCESS

- ▶ NMSC asks principals to verify students' eligibility
- ▶ Commended scores become widely, although unofficially, known

# NATIONAL MERIT PROCESS

- ▶ Semifinalists and Commended students are officially notified
- ▶ Semifinalists are allocated proportionally to each state based on high school populations

# NATIONAL MERIT PROCESS

- ▶ Semifinalists complete their application online
- ▶ Application includes essay, transcript, confirming SAT or ACT score, and recommendation from high school
- ▶ Given opportunity to select first choice college; can always change it later

# NATIONAL MERIT PROCESS

- ▶ Finalists are officially notified
- ▶ Approximately 95% of Semifinalists become Finalists

# HOW TO PREPARE

- ▶ Remember that cutoff scores are VERY high in Texas
- ▶ Dedication to practice is important
- ▶ Ideally, start during or right after sophomore year
- ▶ Focus serious prep and practice during summer between sophomore and junior years



## FINALLY

- ▶ National Merit Scholarships can be worth a lot of scholarship money if you are flexible in where you want to attend
- ▶ Preparation ideally begins by at least the summer between sophomore and junior years
- ▶ Just one way to showcasing what makes you special to colleges!
